Since 2002 the Sussex County MUA has been providing responsible disposal options for consumer electronics (E-Waste), for residents and businesses in the community. Recent State of New Jersey regulatory changes, effective **January 1, 2011**, will now impact E-Waste collection and disposal practices.

*The New Jersey
Electronic Waste Management Act
(N.J.A.C. 7:26A-13)*

Bans the disposal of
“Covered Electronic Devices”
**as Solid Waste (Garbage) and
must be recycled**

“COVERED ELECTRONICS”
include:

- ⇒ **Televisions**
- ⇒ **Computers**
- ⇒ **Monitors**
- ⇒ **Portable/Laptop Computers**



“COVERED ELECTRONICS”
CAN BE RECYCLED @

- N.J. Manufacturers/Retailers
- Municipal Recycling Events
- SCMUA Collection Programs
 - Regular Operations: Scale charges apply
 - Scheduled Free Annual Recycling Events

The New Jersey Electronics Waste Management Act requires manufacturers of televisions and computers to assume responsibility for the recycling of **“Covered Electronic Devices”**, specifically:
Televisions, Computers, Monitors & Portable/Laptop Computers.

Public may contact the manufacturer/retailer for specific guidelines.

“NON-COVERED ELECTRONICS”
include:

- ⇒ **DVD players, VCR’s, scanners, printers & computer peripherals**
- ⇒ **Motor vehicle electronic devices**
- ⇒ **Telephones or Cell Phones**
- ⇒ **All Industrial, Commercial or Medical Electronic Equipment**

“NON-COVERED ELECTRONICS”
CAN BE DISPOSED/RECYCLED @

- SCMUA scheduled Collection Events
- SCMUA Resident’s Convenience Center at the regular scale charge

The Act requires that effective January 1, 2011 “No person shall knowingly dispose of a used covered electronic device, or any of its components or subassemblies, as solid waste”.
