A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF ANDOVER, IN THE COUNTY OF SUSSEX AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY, TO TEMPORARILY AMEND CERTAIN OUTDOOR DINING REQUIREMENTS TO ENABLE LOCAL RESTAURANTS TO IMPLEMENT SOCIAL DISTANCING AND SUPPORT THE REOPENING PROCESS

WHEREAS, recent changes in the economy, including the COVID-19 public health emergency and resulting social distancing requirements, have led the Township to review its outdoor dining requirements; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body desires to support the economic recovery of local restaurants by temporarily relaxing certain outdoor dining restrictions, as recommended by the Township Planner, so that restaurants are able to increase customer traffic while satisfying social distancing requirements; and

WHEREAS, the temporary outdoor dining rules have achieved the goals of supporting and promoting local restaurants while providing safe and accessible dining alternatives for the general public; and

WHEREAS, the Township Planner and the Township Attorney find the temporary provisions satisfactory; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body finds it in the best interest of the Township to temporarily relax certain restrictions.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Committee of the Township of Andover, in the County of Sussex and State of New Jersey, as follows:

- 1. The Andover Township Code, Section 59, including Article iii, Outdoor Dining, shall remain in effect at all times herein; however, outdoor dining and restaurant seating may be expanded in the number of seats, tables and locations for dining, under the direction of the Zoning Officer, provided the total number of seats and/or customers at any one time does not exceed the total permitted restaurant capacity by 10% and does not impede pedestrian and traffic circulation or parking or the public right-of-way. The Zoning Officer may, if necessary, confer with the Chief of Police and Health Officer and provide for specific limitations or conditions of approval.
- 2. A restaurant must continue to follow all rules and regulations of the Health Department and Division of Alcoholic Beverage Control, as well as all applicable local, State and federal law.

- 3. Restaurants may display one temporary sign to notify the public of in-house and takeout dining options and any restrictions in place so long as the signage does not interfere with public safety.
- 4. This shall remain in effect through the end of 2023 unless this resolution is otherwise amended or vacated by the Township Committee.
- 5. The Township Committee, upon notice of an appeal of a decision of the Zoning Officer, reserves the right to amend, affirm or overturn the decision of the Zoning Officer in order to protect the health, safety and welfare of the general public.

This Resolution will take effect immediately.

ORDINANCE #2023-04

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF ANDOVER, COUNTY OF SUSSEX, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, TO ESTABLISH CHAPTER 68A TO REQUIRE LEAD PAINT TESTING AS MANDATED BY P.L. 2021, C.182

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 52:27D-437.1 established the Lead Hazard Control Assistance Act lead-based testing program for residential rental properties; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 52:27D-437.16 now requires all municipalities to inspect every single-family, two-family and multiple rental dwelling located within the municipality at tenant turnover for lead-based paint hazards; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Andover has determined that it is in the best interest of the Township to amend the Township Code to require such inspections to conform with State law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Andover, County of Sussex, State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1. Part 1, General Legislation, of the Township of Andover Code is hereby amended to establish Chapter 68A, Inspections, Lead-Based Paint, to read as follows:

§ 68A-1 Inspections, Lead-Based Paint

A. Definitions. The following term shall have the meanings indicated below pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:27D-437.16 as may be amended and which is incorporated by reference.

DUST WIPE SAMPLING

A sample collected by wiping a representative surface and tested in accordance with a method approved by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development.

TENANT TURNOVER

the time at which all existing occupants vacate a dwelling unit and all new tenants move into the dwelling unit.

VISUAL ASSESSMENT

A visual examination for deteriorated paint or visible surface dust, debris, or residue.

B. Inspections by Township.

most recent cyclical inspection performed on the multiple dwelling under the Hotel and Multiple Dwelling Law (N.J.S.A. 55:13A-1, et seq.);

- (4) is a single-family or two-family seasonal rental dwelling which is rented for less than six months duration each year by tenants that do not have consecutive lease renewals; or
 - (5) has a valid lead-safe certification issued in accordance with this section.

F. Remediation.

If the Construction Code Official, designee, or certified lead evaluation contractor finds that a lead-based paint hazard exists in a dwelling unit upon conducting an inspection pursuant to § 68A-1B, then the owner of the dwelling unit shall remediate the lead-based paint hazard by using abatement or lead-based paint hazard control methods approved in accordance with the provisions of the Lead Hazard Control Assistance Act (N.J.S.A. 52:27D-437.1 et al.). Upon the remediation of the lead-based paint hazard, the Construction Code Official, designee, or certified lead evaluation contractor shall conduct an additional inspection of the unit to certify that the hazard no longer exists. The Construction Code Official shall charge an additional fee in the amount \$75.00 for such additional inspection.

G. Lead-Safe Certification.

If the Construction Code Official, designee, or certified lead evaluation contractor finds that no lead-based paint hazards exist in a dwelling unit upon conducting an inspection pursuant to § 68A-1B or following remediation of a lead-based paint hazard pursuant to § 68A-1F, then the Construction Code Official, designee, or certified lead evaluation contractor shall certify the dwelling unit as lead-safe on a form prescribed by the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs as provided for in regulations or guidance promulgated pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:27D-437.20. The lead-safe certification provided to the property owner by Construction Code Official, designee, or certified lead evaluation contractor shall be valid for two years.

H. Production of Lead-Safe Certification.

Beginning on July 22, 2024, property owners shall:

- (1) Provide evidence of a valid lead-safe certification obtained pursuant to this section as well as evidence of the most recent tenant turnover at the time of the cyclical inspection carried out under the Hotel and Multiple Dwelling Law (N.J.S.A. 55:13A1, et seq.), unless not required to have had an inspection by the Construction Code Official, designee, or certified lead evaluation contractor pursuant to paragraph (1), (2), or (3) of § 68-1E;
- (2) Provide evidence of a valid lead-safe certification obtained pursuant to this section to new tenants of the property at the time of tenant turnover unless not required to have had an inspection by the Construction Code Official, designee, or certified lead evaluation contractor pursuant to paragraphs (1), (2), (3), and (4) of § 68A-1E, and

- 437.16), then the Construction Code Official, designee, or certified lead evaluation contractor may inspect a dwelling located therein for lead-based paint hazards through visual assessment.
- (2) If at least three percent (3%) of children tested, six years of age or younger, have a blood lead level greater than or equal to five ug/dL, according to the central lead screening database maintained by the State of new Jersey Department of Health pursuant to section 5 of P.L.1995, c.328 (C.26:2-137.6), or according to other data deemed appropriate by the commissioner, then the Construction Code Official, designee, or certified lead evaluation contractor shall inspect a dwelling located therein through dust wipe sampling.
- (3) If a lead hazard is identified in an inspection of one of the dwelling units in a building consisting of two- or three- dwelling units, then the Construction Code Official, designee, or certified lead evaluation contractor shall inspect the remainder of the building's dwelling units for lead hazards, with the exception of dwelling units that have been certified to be free of lead-based paint. The inspector may charge fees in accordance with this section for such additional inspections

M. Penalties.

The Township and the Construction Code Official, designee, or certified lead evaluation contractor shall be authorized to conduct investigations and issue penalties to enforce a property owner's failure to comply with N.J.S.A. 52:27D-437.16 or this section. If the Township or the inspector determines that a property owner has failed to comply with a provision of N.J.S.A. 52:27D-437.16, et seq. or this section regarding a rental dwelling unit owned by the property owner, the property owner shall first be given thirty (30) days to cure any violation by conducting the required inspection or initiate any required remediation efforts. If the property owner has not cured the violation after thirty (30) days, the property owner shall be subject to a penalty not to exceed \$1,000.00 per week until the required inspection has been conducted or remediation efforts have been initiated.

- SECTION 2. This ordinance may be renumbered for the purposes of codification.
- **SECTION 3**. Ordinances, resolutions, regulations or parts of ordinances, resolutions and regulations inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistencies.
- **SECTION 4**. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such a decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.
- **SECTION 5**. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage, approval and publication as required by law.

CALENDAR YEAR 2023 AN ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14)

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to 2.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Township of Andover in the County of Sussex finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2022 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the governing body hereby determines that a 1% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$73,887.68 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS the governing body_hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the governing body of the Township of Andover, in the County of Sussex, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2022 budget year, the final appropriations of the Township of Andover shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 3.5%, amounting to \$258,606.88, and that the CY 2023 municipal budget for the Township of Andover be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF ANDOVER, COUNTY OF SUSSEX, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AMENDING THE TOWNSHIP CODE CHAPTER 3 AND ESTABLISH THE SECTION 113, ENTITLED "MUNICIPAL BUILDINGS, RESTRICTED AREAS TO SAFEGUARD RECORDS"

WHEREAS, Township of Andover officials and employees are entrusted with the responsibility to maintain and safeguard public records that consist of or contain information deemed confidential pursuant to federal, State or local law; and

WHEREAS, to ensure compliance with such laws, including the New Jersey Open Public Records Act ("OPRA") set forth at N.J.S.A. 47:1A-1 et esq. and its statutorily defined responsibilities, the maintenance and custody of specific records are required; and

WHEREAS, municipal officials assigned this responsibility include, but are not limited to, the Municipal Clerk, Police Chief, Chief Financial Officer, Tax Collector, Tax Assessor, Construction Code Officer, Board of Health Secretary, and the Township Administrator; and

WHEREAS, due to this responsibility to maintain and safeguard records, reports, documents and information in municipal offices, records may not be available for immediate public viewing since they may contain personal information, phone numbers, social security numbers, medical data and other confidential information; and

WHEREAS, securing these records maintains the integrity of this information and when an OPRA request is received, and it is determined that a requestor is entitled to the records, the records can be released individually and redacted as required by law; and

WHEREAS, securing and keeping these records confidential will support a safe workplace while balancing public access in Town Hall; and

WHEREAS, we cannot expect our municipal employees to physically intervene to protect a record, or other Township assets or personal belongings, and creating secure areas with clear signage will help deter persons from collecting records that they are not entitled to receive without following the process required by OPRA.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Township Committee of the Township of Andover, County of Sussex and State of New Jersey as follows:

SECTION 1. Part 1: General Legislation, of the Code of the Township of Andover, Chapter 3 entitled Administration of Government is hereby amended to establish Section 113 entitled "Municipal Buildings, Restricted Areas to Safeguard Records" to read as follows in its entirety:

Chapter 3-113. Municipal Buildings, Restricted Areas to Safeguard Records

- §3-113- 1. Purpose. While the general public may permitted to access Township buildings during regular business hours, the intent of this Chapter is to safeguard public records that may contain confidential information or may be exempt from disclosure under the Open Public Records Act, other Township assets, and personal belongings, and ensure a safe workplace, by restricting access to work stations and work areas where such records, assets and personal belongings are maintained.
- §3-113 -2. Restricted areas. Municipal office areas in Town Hall including DPW offices, located at 134 Newton-Sparta Road and the Police Department located at 145 Lake Iliff Road, Newton, NJ 07860, have been secured and are closed to the public for the purposes set forth in this section, including protecting documents, digital data and other written, copied or printed materials that may contain confidential information that is protected by the federal, State or local laws. These area include, but are not limited to, the following departments:
 - 1. Administration Office
 - 2. Deputy Clerk/Registrar Office
 - 3. Assistant Clerk I and II Office
 - 4. Construction Department
 - 5. Zoning Department
 - 6. Land Use Department
 - 7. Mail & Supply Rooms
 - 8. Server Room
 - 9. Employee Restrooms and Kitchen
 - 10. CFO Office
 - 11. Deputy Treasurer Office
 - 12. Tax Assessor Office
 - 13. Tax Collector Office
 - 14. Conference Room
 - 15. Court Offices and Judges Chambers
 - 16. Vault and Storage Areas
 - 17. Utility Closets
 - 18. Atlantic Ambulance Quarters
 - 19. DPW (except for the main office entrance)
 - 20. Police Department (except for lobby area)
- §3-113 -3. Signage. The Township of Andover shall post signs outside of restricted offices and work areas that read, "Stop, Restricted Area, Authorized Employees Only".
- §3-113 -4. Violations. Any unauthorized person who violates any provision of this chapter shall be subject to either an ordinance violation up to the maximum penalties provided in Part 1, General Legislation, Chapter 1, General Provisions, Article II, General Penalty, of this Code at the discretion of the municipal court judge, or criminal prosecution under N.J.S.A. 2C-18-3.
- **SECTION 2**. If any portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent portion, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.
- **SECTION 3**. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are repealed as to such inconsistencies.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication in the manner according to law.

ORDINANCE #2023-03

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF ANDOVER, COUNTY OF SUSSEX, STATE OF NEW JERSEY AMENDING CHAPTER 167, "TOWING AND STORAGE," SECTION 16, "TOWING AND STORAGE FEE SCHEDULE," OF THE TOWNSHIP CODE

WHEREAS, pursuant to <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40:48-2.49, the Township Committee of the Township of Andover regulates towing services in the Township; and

WHEREAS, the Township's towing and storage fee schedule was last updated in 2009 and is in need of updating; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee has reviewed the most recent 'Maximum N.J. State Police Rates' for towing and storage, consulting these rates as a guideline in determining its revisions to the Township's towing and storage fee schedule.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Andover that the Code of the Township of Andover shall be amended as follows:

SECTION 1.

§ 167-16 Towing and storage fee schedule.

The following fees are established as being the usual, customary, and reasonable rates which shall be charged for towing and storage of automobiles defined as basic towing service:

- A. Class 1 and Class 2 vehicles.
 - 1. Road service.
 - a. Days (between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday): \$150 per hour, no mileage fee.
 - b. Nights (between the hours of 5:01 p.m. and 7:59 a.m., Monday through Friday; weekends; or on New Jersey state holidays): \$180 per hour, no mileage fee.
 - 2. Impound tows (written Police Department release required).

- a. Days (between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday): \$180 per hour and \$7 per mile (portal to portal).
- b. Nights (between the hours of 5:01 p.m. and 7:59 a.m., Monday through Friday); weekends; or on New Jersey state holidays: \$205 per hour and \$7 per mile (portal to portal).

3. Disabled tow to duty vendor.

- a. Days (between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday): \$180 per hour, no mileage fee.
- b. Nights (between the hours of 5:01 p.m. and 7:59 a.m., Monday through Friday); weekends; or on New Jersey state holidays: \$205 per hour, no mileage fee.

4. Accident tows.

- a. Days (between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday): \$180 per hour and \$7 per mile (portal to portal).
- b. Nights (between the hours of 5:01 p.m. and 7:59 a.m., Monday through Friday; weekends; or on New Jersey state holidays: \$205 per hour and \$7 per mile (portal to portal).
- 5. Winching/cleanup/recovery: \$350 per hour.
- 6. Storage: \$50 per day.
 - a. There shall be a twelve-hour mandatory DWI hold for which the daily storage fee shall be waived unless the vehicle is not picked up after the waiting period
 - b. For disabled vehicles, the storage fee shall be waived when the vehicle is serviced or repaired by duty vendor.
 - c. The storage fee shall also be waived if the vehicle is picked up the same day it comes in

7. Additional charges.

- a. Speedy dry: \$35 per container.
- b. No-key charge: \$40.

B. Class 3 to Class 8 vehicles.

- 1. Road service.
 - a. Days (between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday): \$150 per hour.
 - b. Nights (between the hours of 5:01 p.m. and 7:59 a.m., Monday through Friday; weekends; or on New Jersey state holidays): \$180 per hour, with a two-hour minimum.
 - 2. Disabled or impound tows (written Police Department release required).
 - a. Days (between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday): \$180 per hour and \$7 per mile (portal to portal).
 - b. Nights (between the hours of 5:01 p.m. and 7:59 a.m., Monday through Friday); weekends; or on New Jersey state holidays: \$205 per hour and \$7 per mile (portal to portal).
- 3. Class 3 and Class 4 portal to portal.
 - a. Days (between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday): \$230 per hour.
 - b. Nights (between the hours of 5:01 p.m. and 7:59 a.m., Monday through Friday; weekends; or on New Jersey state holidays: \$275 per hour.
- 4. Class 5 and Class 6 portal to portal.
 - a. Days (between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday): \$305 per hour.
 - b. Nights (between the hours of 5:01 p.m. and 7:59 a.m., Monday through Friday; weekends; or on New Jersey state holidays: \$355 per hour.
- 5. Class 7 and Class 8 portal to portal.
 - a. Days (between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday): \$405 per hour.

- b. Nights (between the hours of 5:01 p.m. and 7:59 a.m., Monday through Friday; weekends; or on New Jersey state holidays: \$430 per hour.
- 6. Accident recovery rates for Class 3 through Class 8 vehicles, minimum weights apply.

15,000 lbs.: RV/Motor homes 30,000 lbs.: Bus/straight trucks

60,000 lbs.: Tractor/trailers weights apply.

- a. Normal recovery on or near roadway: 1% of declared value of recovered cargo plus:
 - [1] Contained recovery/winching: \$0.42 per pound.
 - [2] Salvage and debris recovery: \$0.54 per pound.
 - [3] Inclement weather: \$0.18 per pound.
 - [4] Nights/holidays/weekends: \$0.18 per pound.
 - [5] Travel to location: \$0.30 per pound.
 - [6] Wheels higher than roof: \$0.12 per pound.
 - [7] Embankments or inclines: \$0.12 per pound.
 - [8] Back door frame open: \$0.12 per pound.
 - [9] Tractor from under trailer: \$0.12 per pound
 - [10] Major suspension damage: \$0.60 per pound.
 - [11] Handle complete clean up: \$0.60 per pound.
 - [12] 30 M.P.H. Speed Zone: \$0.24 per pound.
 - [13] 50 M.P.H. Speed Zone: \$0.36 per pound.
- b. Additional surcharges shall apply to HAZMAT incidents.

SECTION 2. This Ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication according to law.

SECTION 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

<u>SECTION 4</u>. If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence or any part of this Ordinance is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder of this Ordinance not directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered.

SECTION 5. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage, approval, and publication as required by law.

SECTION 6. This Ordinance may be renumbered for codification purposes.
